2 Singing

Sing the ABC's in different voices. Try a silly voice or a scary voice. Maybe even try a whisper voice.

4 Writing

Trace your hand and decorate it.

5 Counting

Go outside and dig in the snow. Count the number of sticks, leaves or rocks you may find while digging.

Bring some snow in from outside and build a snowman.

Look out the window and name the animals that you see.

Singing

Celebrate *Bubble Bath Day* by taking a bath and singing your favorite nursery rhymes.

Read a book about winter.

10 Writing

Practice writing the third letter of your name.

Go for a walk and count the number of steps you take.

12 Playing

Put some water outside in a plastic container and see how long it takes to freeze.

Talk about why water freezes.

Sing the 5 Little Snowmen song today.

15 Reading

Look at some pictures and make a story about them.

16 Writing

Draw a thank you note for a family member.

7 Counting

Count the gloves and mittens in your house.

18 Playing

Break the winter blues by having a dance party!

19 Talking

Talk about the 4 seasons. What are they called?

20 Singing

Sing the *Hibernation* song today.

Reading

Read a new book by a favorite author.

22 Writing

Color a winter scene picture.

23 Counting

Practice counting by 2's.

30 Playing

Build a fort and hang out inside.

24 Playing

Play with puzzles.

31 **Talking**

Talk about one thing you can't do in the winter.

25 Talking

It's National Opposites Day.
Dress in opposite types of clothing than your family members and talk about what "opposite" means.

26 Singing

Sing a bedtime song to your toys.

27 Reading

Read a book about bears.

28 Writing

Draw a snowman picture and give it a name. Try writing the letters of the name you chose.

29 Counting

Practice counting backwards from 10 to 1.

Grow Up Reading™ Tips for January: Reading

- Don't expect your toddler to sit still for a book. Toddlers need to move, so don't worry. if they act out stories or just skip or tumble as you read to them. They may be moving, but they are listening.
- Read favorite stories again and again. Books about things your toddler enjoys like trains, animals, dragons, etc. are great to read over and over again. These books may extend a toddler's attention span and build enthusiasm for reading.
- Try using your child's name as the name of a character in the book. Have fun reading and show your child that reading is enjoyable.
