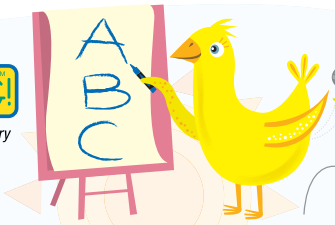
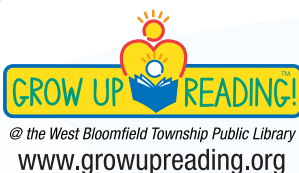
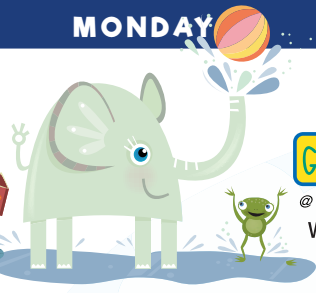

3 Reading

5 Counting

Count the birds outside your window.

6 Playing

Stand up empty bottles and roll a ball to knock them over.

7 Talking

Talk about words that start with the letter "J" like June.

8 Singing

Celebrate World Ocean Day by singing Row, Row, Row Your Boat today.

9 Reading

Read your favorite book with a family member.

10 Writing

Write/draw a to-do list for your day.

11 Counting

Count five different types of plants outside.

12 Playing

Play a game of musical chairs but use pillows instead of chairs.

13 Talking

Talk about something exciting that happened this week.

14 Singing

Clap out the rhythm as you sing to a song on the radio.

15 Reading

It's Summer Reading kickoff at the Main Library! Stop by between 11 AM – 4 PM to have fun and sign up for summer reading.

16 Writing

Practice writing the letters S-U-N.

17 Counting

Before reading a book together count the number of pages in the book.

18 Playing

Go on an outdoor scavenger hunt for shapes. How many different shapes can you find?

19 Talking

Talk about things you would pack for a picnic.

20 Singing

Have fun singing Clap Your Hands while moving and grooving today.

21 Reading

Read a book with a green cover.

22 Writing

Practice cutting with pieces of scrap paper.

23 Counting

Count to 10.

24 Playing

Dance around like the different farm animals you've talked about this month.

25 Talking

Talk about the different sounds animals make.

26 Singing

Visit the Main Library or the Westacres Branch for storytime today. Have fun singing and dancing along.

27 Reading

Visit the Amazing Astronomy program at the Main Library at 2 PM.

28 Writing

Draw pictures of items that have spots, for example a Dalmation or a ladybug.

29 Counting

Count the number of months that start with the letter "J" on a calendar.

30 Playing

Visit a nearby park today.

Grow Up Reading™ Tips for June: Reading and Playing

- Recognize the need to play! Remember summers as a child when it seemed like all you did was play and swim and play some more? As adults, we forget that we can and should still play, especially with our children. Even if you are not the type to ride a bike or play ball with your children, challenge yourself to find a way to “let go” and “go play!”
- Make trips a way to encourage reading by reading aloud traffic signs, billboards, and notices.
- Visit the library frequently and look for summer reading programs. Libraries can be magical places during the summer, and the West Bloomfield Township Public Library has summer reading programs, book clubs, and events for kids like puppet shows or storyteller presentations. They also may provide age-appropriate summer reading lists. Check the library calendar for special events throughout the summer.
