Stories from books can be used to encourage play and placing a combination of different objects throughout the room can stimulate your child's creativity. Offering a range of materials—a variety of shapes and sizes of blocks, dolls and hand puppets, items from nature—increases the potential of exposing children to things they haven't experienced before.


